The no shooting sign on Burgess and Womack has been reinstalled, as well as the exit only sign at the Sulphurous Park.

We have hired a young person to mow the lawns on a few of our accesses, however most are still being cared for by local volunteers. As some of our picnic tables are starting to wear, we will be replacing some of them throughout the year.

Take note of our sign board on the Community Board on Mahood by Horse Lake Road. Updated communication can be found there on a regular basis. In addition, when possible, please support our advertisers as they are here to support our community.

As you know we relocated our recycling bins for your convenience to the mail boxes on Blain, Beazely and Higgins Roads. We continue to receive positive results on the new locations. A reminder, these bins are to support your local ratepayers and assist in upgrading projects in all our 4 lake communities.

Please contact us if any of the accesses require some form of maintenance and is something you are not able to help out with. Please respect our accesses by allowing boats to launch safely, swim safely and park in the designated parking areas only. The turn-a-rounds at the bottom of access 6, 8 and 12 are there for a reason and need to be clear of any parking.

We are still working in changing our webmaster on our website so you may have difficulty getting into some of the tabs. Please be patient as we are working on securing a more usable friendly site and will notify you all when we have upgraded it.




