It has been an interesting year as we are still waiting for spring to arrive. We were swimming in the Lake in early May last year and this year have not dipped our feet into the water to date.

We are still hoping to get a bit more gravel for the Hathaway launch making it a little easier to back down to the lake. Since Covid rules have relaxed a bit, many of our business partners are extremely busy so will get on it as soon as possible. Remember to put your vehicle in 4 wheel drive when pulling out and rake out the holes if you happen to spin out. Don't forget there is a fishing wharf that can be found off the parking lot past the outhouse for everyone to enjoy.

We will be concentrating our efforts on Access 11 at Deka Lake later this year. There is a pathway down to the lake off Womack just before Beazley 1. We will be bringing in more gravel and clean up the area close to the lake to make it a bit more user friendly. Stay tuned. Thank you to CRD for giving us a grant to help with these expenses.

The wharf at Higgins Lake is being well used. There are 2 port potties in this location, one for handicapped only and the second for everyone else. The handicapped washroom has a smaller holding tank so we are asking that you allow those who need the additional space to use it only. New signage will be displayed once it has been done.

There is not allot to be done at the Sulphurous launch and trails other than general maintenance. A few of the residences have agreed to look after the outhouse and lawn maintenance but I know they would appreciate any additional volunteers from the area that have a bit of time to take on the weed eating and raking.

I understand the lakes have all been stocked and that fishing has improved this spring.

We are reminding everyone again this year that the Emergency Access Road at the end of Womack is not to be used as a short cut or for general use to get over to Windy Mountain. It is an emergency road only and will not be maintained by anyone. As we all know, the more a dirt road is used, the rougher it gets. We must as a community ensure that this road is kept in the condition that it can accommodate not only trucks but small cars to escape the area if needed.

Our recycling program at the Fire Hall is still running and is status quo for now. Thank you to everyone who is supporting this program and dropping off their bottles and cans at the fire hall. 100% of the proceeds goes back into the community.

I would like to thank everyone for their feedback on our survey that was sent out back in April. 97% who responded were requesting that we continue to pursue Hall access, while still ensuring that we continue to support our Volunteer Fire Department. We appreciate all of the comments and suggestions and welcome continued feedback on our efforts in all aspects of what we do. Access improvement, suggestions on how we can make our community stronger and building stronger relationships with our local partners.

I continue to be so impressed with the people who use and care for all of our local accesses at all 4 lakes. Taking the time to make even the smallest effort to clean up the lake shore, taking your garbage out, cleaning up some brush and simply sharing space respectfully with others has not been unnoticed. We are a great community with great people and are an admiration to almost every community in the Cariboo.

Gentle reminder to please park in the designated parking spots and not in the roundabouts. Let your friends and family who come to visit know the rules of the road and what they can do to help out.

As our community is growing in great strides we will need more community support, more volunteers, and keeping an eye on each other. Our community depends on working together and taking care of what we have.

As the DLVFD no longer allows community access to the fire hall property, they will be hosting different events throughout the community at various locations, including the lake accesses. These events may include bake sales and 50/50 draws along with a membership drive.

To remain connected to the DLVFD, the current name will stand, but discussions are in place to update the name to represent the entire community. All previous members who paid their dues by May would be considered paid members of the new group.

#### Local FYI-Dianna Forster

"to the best of my belief and knowledge"

It is <u>Interlakes Community Centre</u> run by ICC Society, which is the programme department of Roe Lake & District Recreation Commission, which owns the facilities on behalf of every Interlakes resident, and is a registered charity.

The term "Interlakes" had been coined by the then newly-formed **Highway 24/Interlakes Lions** Club, to make sure it invited residents from ALL our lakes including Horse Lake.

ICC was **Roe Lake Hall** until it was rebuilt following the fire and in late '89, then-directors chose to follow the Lions' lead, changing it to "Interlakes Hall."

At some point, indirectly related to 911 and before 2004, insurance costs went through the roof, almost tripling, such that no community hall could afford it. That was when CRD Area Directors requested a CRD referendum asking taxpayers if they would pay what was a VERY small amount to help their community halls (in our case, only those within Area L) pay for insurance, heat and major expenses like roof, furnace, etc., and it included a maximum amount they could raise. It passed with something like 98% support. (In 2021, this cost US a mere \$17.)

- This community (nicknamed "Interlakes") is sparsely-populated and geographically hugebetween GreenLake and 100 Mile House, and stretching from Hway 97 east to hway 5.
- RLDRC (originally W.I.) has been in existence since the 50's, facilitated wholly by community members.
- There is no longer any long term debt.
- It was the first-approved "Recreation Commission."
- RLDRC was registered in Victoria in 1977.
- In 1988, the original hall burned down; rebuilt with (?? approx 50% insurance & 50% comm, donations)
- RLDRC's approx. 100-150 volunteers receive no remuneration of any kind.

**HIGGINS LAKE** is named for pioneer Ed Higgins who moved here from the States with his family in 1914 and homesteaded at Roe Lake.

Very knowledgeable in local geography, Higgins led government surveyors on their rounds, and they chose to name this lake after him.

**DEKA LAKE** seems to be named after friendly native, Billy "English" Decker, who roamed this part of the countryside befriending new settlers. His people called him "English" because he was the first one in the family to read and write the language. English Lake is named after him, and he is the only suggested origin for the name of Deka Lake.

**SULPHUROUS LAKE** is named for a large yellow bottom patch visible from the air, which was thought to be sulphur, but is not.

HATHAWAY LAKE is named for resident Bill Hathaway who eventually moved to Vancouver Island and, were he still to be alive, would be brushing 112 years old.

WOMACK ROAD is named for Charlie and Marg Womack who were early residents of Deka Lake. As related by the late Dave Lackey on their 60th wedding anniversary, the Womacks ran a guide/outfitter business. Over the years, they bought and sold well over 1,000 acres which included the original Deka Lake Resort property, until they sold it to Tom Hurst in 1960. (Hurst went on to develop Deka Subdivision.)

Financial survival was such that the Womacks returned to Oregon for perhaps a dozen winters over their 40 years here, to make enough money to come back to Deka Lake the following year. Charlie was responsible for pushing the road through from Deka Lake to Needa Lake; and once had a 10-minute staring match with a grizzly before it turned and walked away.

He was also an expert marksman with 75 trophies he had won in five States and five Provinces, and

he once represented Canada in an Olympic shooting event.



- 1, 3, 9 and 11 are accesses only.
- 2,4,5,6,7,8,10,12 and Mathura are launches as well.
- 6,7,8, and 12 have portapotties.

Access 3 at Higgins has a fishing dock and portapotty

Boat Launch at Sulphurous has picnic tables, outhouse and walking trail.

Picnic area on Hathaway has 2 tables, fishing dock, outhouse and walking trail.
